

Demographics in Context: the Potential Effects of COVID-19


The COVID-19 pandemic has had effects not only on JOURNEYS' day-to-day operations, but also on the number and demographics of our clients. The graph on the opposite page illustrates data from our **last five fiscal years**. It compares JOURNEYS' **total clients** to the number who are **experiencing homelessness** versus those who are **at risk of homelessness**.

Between Fiscal Year 2017-18 and Fiscal Year 2020-21, our total number of clients gradually decreased, and the number of homeless clients and at-risk clients decreased more or less in proportion between FY 2017-18 and FY 2019-20.

Fiscal Year 2020-21, however, while indicating an **overall decrease in the number of clients** (almost certainly due to the limitations brought on by COVID-19), also shows an **increase in at-risk clients to homeless clients**. The past fiscal year illustrates a client total that not only returned to pre-pandemic numbers, but also exceeded the total number of clients for the past four years. **Despite this return to pre-pandemic numbers, the proportion of homeless clients to at-risk clients has not returned to its pre-pandemic levels**. Previous years have shown a larger number of homeless to at-risk clients, while Fiscal Year 2021-22 shows an **even divide between these groups**.


It is also worth noting that **food assistance in particular has seen a substantial increase** since the effects of the pandemic became visible in our yearly data (FY 2020-21). During the pre-pandemic years of the last five, food assistance was highest in **FY 2017-18 at 926 instances**, while the **past fiscal year saw at total of 1,451 instances**. While the data do not substantiate a long-term correlation between the proportion of clients at-risk of homelessness to food assistance administered, the data do suggest such a correlation since FY 2020-21 and the significant increase in at-risk clients.


We cannot claim with absolute certainty that the COVID-19 pandemic is the cause of these changes in our demographics and services. However, the pandemic has undoubtedly made JOURNEYS stronger and proven that we are a resilient community empowered by its people and sustained by partnership.


Survived Domestic Abuse.




Have a Disabling Condition.

Homelessness can affect anyone, but many of our clients belong to particularly vulnerable groups. As our numbers continue to rise after a drop during the height of the pandemic, the percentage represented by each group has remained largely the same, with the exceptions of surviors of domestic abuse and clients with disabilities. Since last year, the former has risen 6%, while the latter has declined 4%.

Emergency Hotel Shelter Program

The COVID-19 pandemic presented unique challenges to JOURNEYS' operations beginning in March 2020. Since then, JOURNEYS began moving clients into local hotels in order to better protect clients from exposure to the virus.

This past fiscal year, we have maintained the Emergency Hotel Shelter Program with wonderful success. Faith communities and local businesses continue to provide meals to our clients, which are transported by our bus drivers, Bob and Bruce.

PADS Shelter Program

This past winter and spring, we were able to reintroduce the PADS Shelter Program with limited capacity at First Presbyterian of Arlington Heights, Congregational United Church of Christ, and St. Alphonsus Liguori. We were also able to open the HOPE Center as a PADS site beginning in March.

We are lucky to have had such committed faith-community partners during a time when the COVID-19 pandemic made opening shelters a much more difficult and complicated process. We are looking forward to partnering again with these congregations for the coming PADS season and hope for renewed partnerships with more faith communities.

We're always in need of more volunteers, especially as we transition from our Emergency Hotel Shelter Program back to PADS sites this fall.








Signature Events




